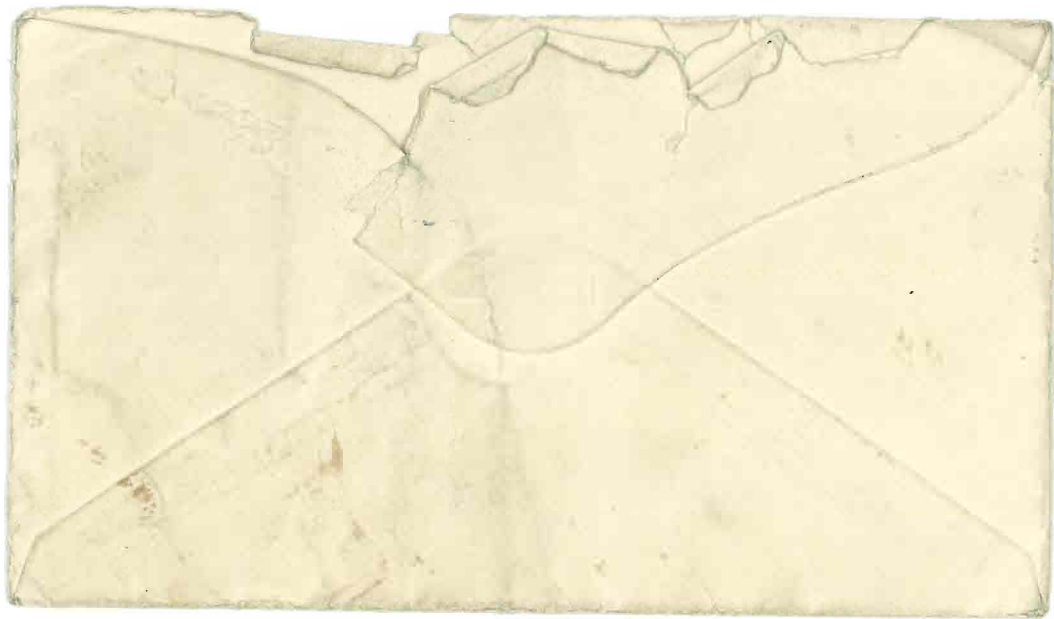

MR CAWTHRON'S WILL

A GREAT PUBLIC BEQUEST.

INDUSTRIAL, AND TECHNICAL,
INSTITUTE AND MUSEUM.

The will of the late Mr Thomas Cawthron confers upon the public the greatest of the many fine benefactions we owe to his generosity (states the Nelson Colonist). By it he devises the bulk of his estate for the erection and maintenance of an Industrial and Technical School, Institute, and Museum, which is calculated to serve most important and valuable purposes of a wide range, and largely in the direction of scientific research bearing upon industry and commerce.

After making the usual provision for the payment of debts, funeral and testamentary expenses, the will proceeds, "and the erection of a tomb in Trafalgar Street Cemetery in Nelson to the memory of all my relatives buried there and myself." Then follows the disposal of residential property to certain relatives, after which the will proceeds "and I will and bequeath all other real and personal property belonging to me unto the Bishop of Nelson, the Mayor of Nelson, the chairman of the Waimea County Council, the Members of the House of Representatives and Legislative Council for the City of Nelson and Waimea electorate, the chairman of the Nelson Harbor Board, and William Rout, the younger, of the city of Nelson, all in trust and who are all also to be the executors of this my will, for the purchase of land and erection and maintenance of an Industrial and Technical School, Institute, and Museum, to be called the Cawthron Institute, after payment of the following sums out of my estate. . . ." Then follows a list of annuities and legacies to relatives.

The will, a holograph one, was signed and attested in London on December 15th, 1902. The witnesses making the attestation were the accountant and a clerk in the Bank of New Zealand, London branch.

It is impossible at present to state the value of the estate, but it is generally supposed that it will prove at something in the neighborhood of a quarter of a million sterling.

(1) If you have not already volunteered for service, are you, if a single man without dependents, willing to become a member of the Expeditionary Forces?

(2) Are you, if a single man with dependents or a married man or widower with dependents, willing, to become a member of the Expeditionary Forces if required?

ATTACKS ON MEUSE HEIGHTS.

GERMANS GAIN FOOTING IN ONE TRENCH.

(Received July 18, 11.30 p.m.)

PARIS, July 18.

Official: There was no infantry action in the Argonne yesterday. The Germans made a violent attack on the heights of the Meuse against our positions from Callonne trench to Les Eparges, but only succeeded in regaining a footing in one trench section, which we captured on the 6th. Some parties of Germans who crept into the ravine were killed or made prisoners.

THE STRUGGLE IN THE VOSGES.

FIGHTING ON HILL 627.

TWO BAVARIAN BATTALIONS WIPED OUT.

(Received July 19, 8.55 a.m.)

PARIS, July 18.

A French "eye-witness" of the fighting in the Vosges describes the attack on Hill 627, dominating the region of Fontenelle and Lanmois. The Germans, by saps exploding powerful mines, approached within twenty metres of our position. The hill was then assaulted at a cost of very heavy losses. They succeeded in establishing themselves on the summit on June 22nd.

The Germans endeavored to transform it into an impregnable fortress. The French preparations for recapturing the hill were completed on July 8th, when three columns supported by numerous artillery, scaled the height and carried it after two days' fighting. The whole garrison, two battalions of the Fifth Bavarian Ersatz Brigade, were killed or made prisoners. Thanks to the rapidity of our movements the French losses were barely a-quarter of those of the Germans. The principal attack against the centre of the hill was successful in less than ten minutes.

The chief credit was due to the artillery. The prisoners are all suffering from nervous shock, due to the bombardment. They expressed horror at the shelling to which they were exposed. The German defence was practically wiped out, though it comprised five lines of trenches. The dug-outs were extremely deep and the flanking works were constructed so that they could enfilade our position if we got a foothold. The works were protected by trunks of trees, while corrugated iron and gun-shields formed the embrasures.

ENEMY'S CLAIMS.

FRENCH ATTACK IN THE ARGONNE FAILS.

BLOODY LOSSES INFLICTED.

7000 FRENCH CAPTURED.

(Received July 17, 2.30 p.m.)

PARIS, July 16.

Despite the French explanation, the Crown Prince continues his audacious claims of victory.

To-day's Berlin communique states that a French attack west of the Argonne failed. The North German Landwehr inflicted bloody losses on the enemy, taking 462 prisoners. We have captured since the 20th 106 officers and 7000 men in the Argonne

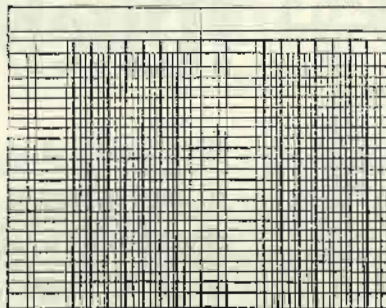

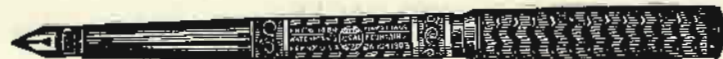

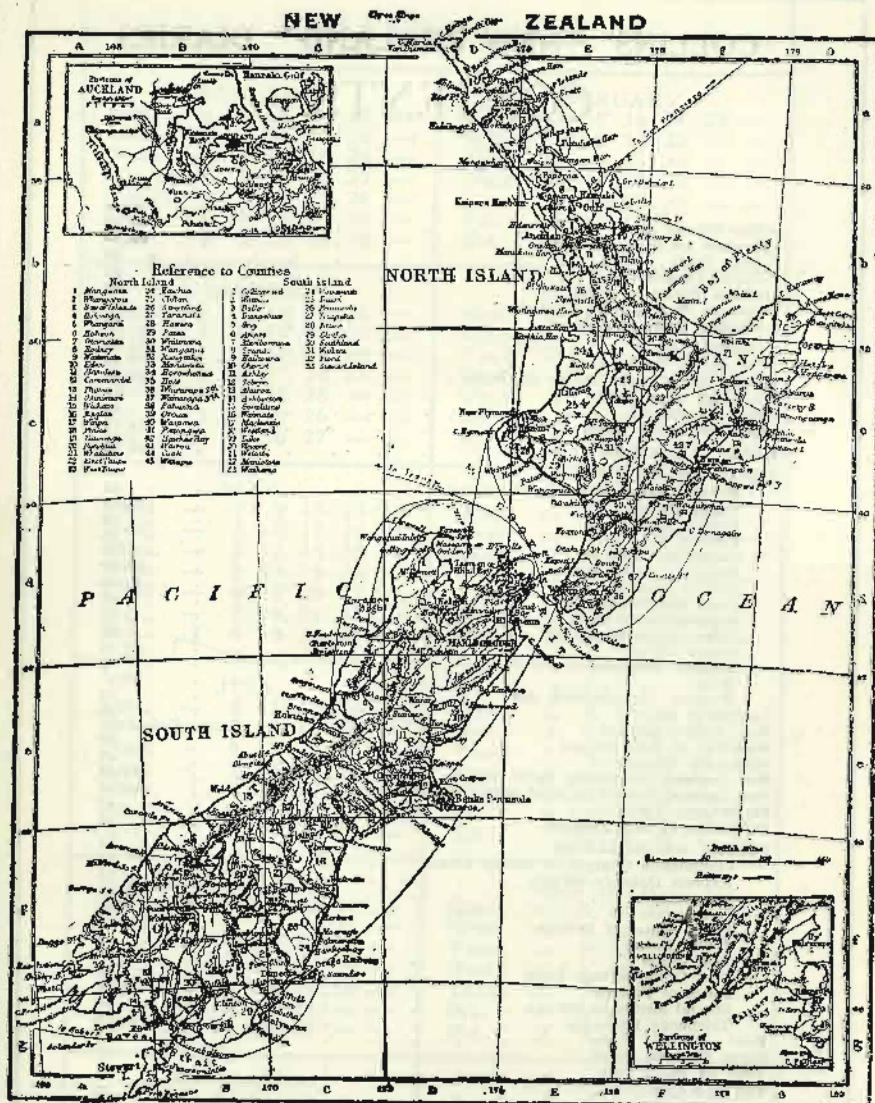
