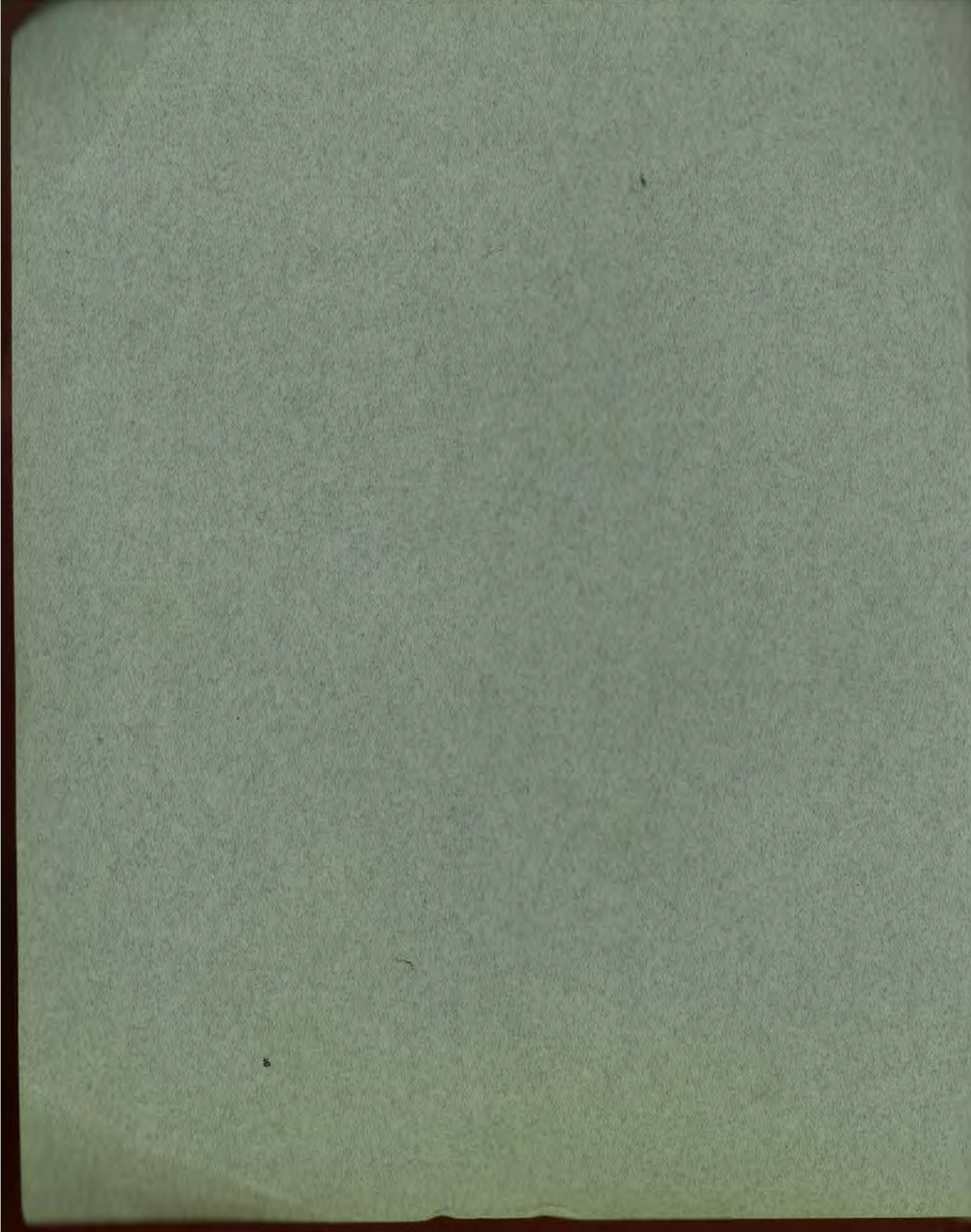

MAP OF ANZAC AREA



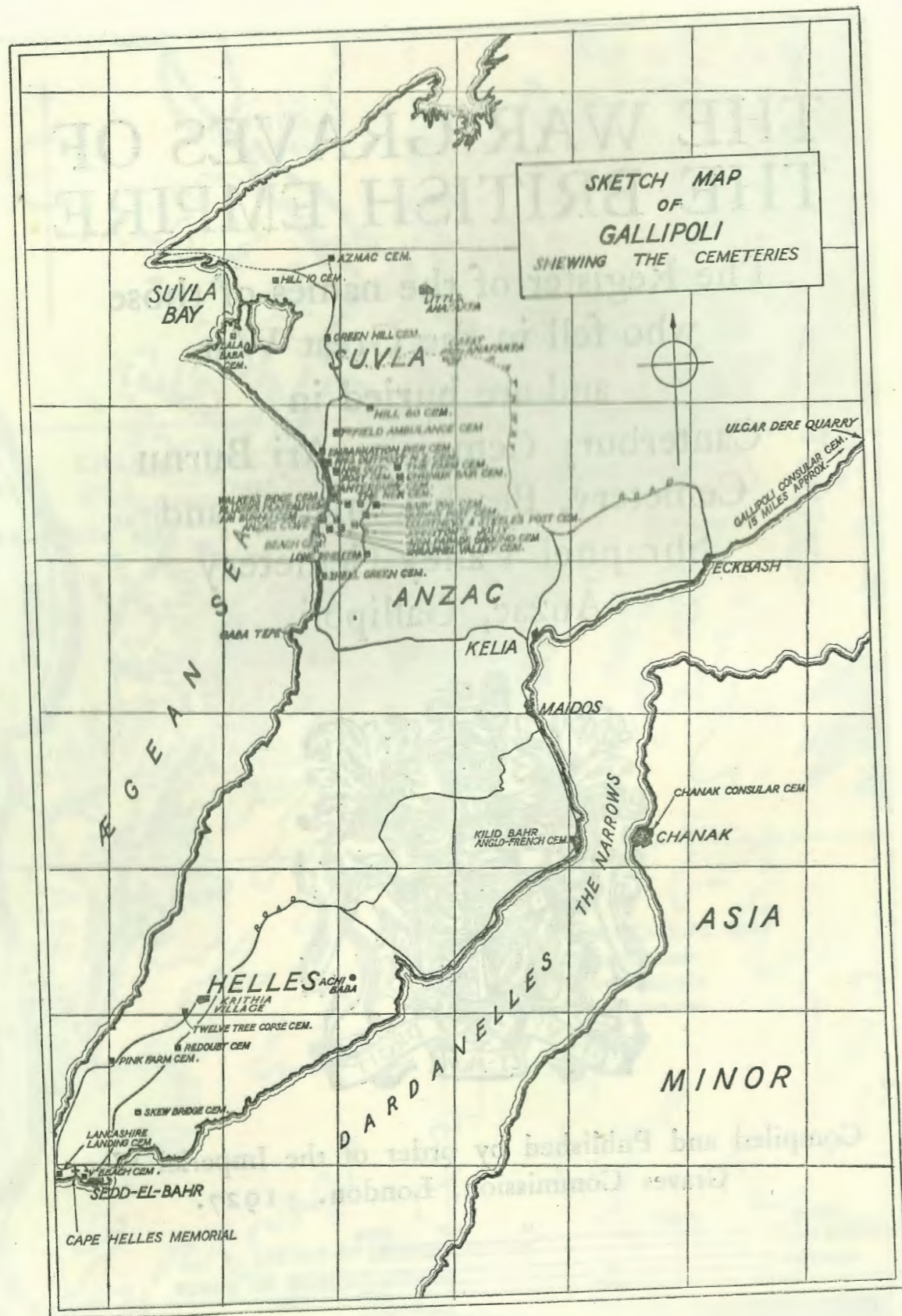

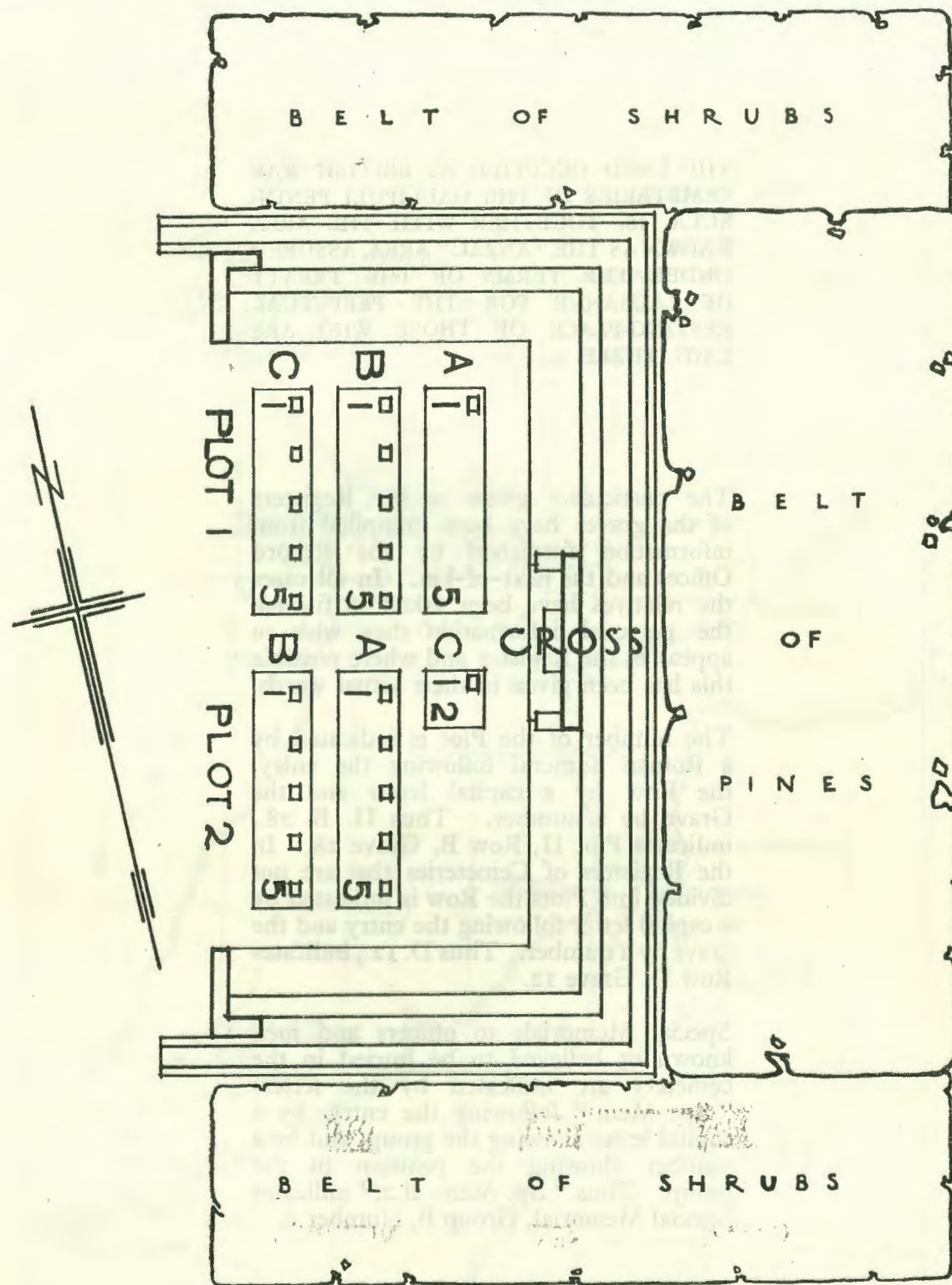


THE LAND OCCUPIED AS BRITISH WAR CEMETERIES IN THE GALLIPOLI PENINSULA, IS, TOGETHER WITH THE AREA KNOWN AS THE "ANZAC" AREA, ASSURED UNDER THE TERMS OF THE TREATY OF LAUSANNE FOR THE PERPETUAL RESTING-PLACE OF THOSE WHO ARE LAID THERE.

The particulars given in the Registers of the graves have been compiled from information furnished by the Record Offices and the next-of-kin. In all cases the relatives have been asked to furnish the personal information they wish to appear in the Register and where possible this has been given in their actual words.

The number of the Plot is indicated by a Roman numeral following the entry, the Row by a capital letter and the Grave by a number. Thus II. B. 28., indicates Plot II, Row B, Grave 28. In the Registers of Cemeteries that are not divided into Plots the Row is indicated by a capital letter following the entry and the grave by a number. Thus D. 12., indicates Row D, Grave 12.

Special Memorials to officers and men known or believed to be buried in the cemetery are indicated by the letters "Sp. Mem." following the entry, by a capital letter showing the group, and by a number showing the position in the group. Thus "Sp. Mem. B.2," indicates Special Memorial, Group B, Number 2.

CANTERBURY CEMETERY, ANZAC

CEMETERY INDEX NUMBER GI. 28.

ANZAC is the midmost of the three areas into which the fighting on Gallipoli, and the cemeteries on the Peninsula, are divided. The origin of the name, and the general course of the fighting in 1915, are stated in the Register of the Lone Pine Memorial.

CANTERBURY CEMETERY is one of the central cemeteries in Anzac. It is on the East side of the road from Suvla to Ari Burnu, close to Fisherman's Hut. It was made after the Armistice. It covers an area of 416 square yards; and it contains the graves of 26 soldiers from New Zealand (20 of whom belonged to the New Zealand Mounted Rifles) and one whose unit in our forces could not be identified.

The cemetery is surrounded by a belt of pines or shrubs on three sides, and the front is left open.

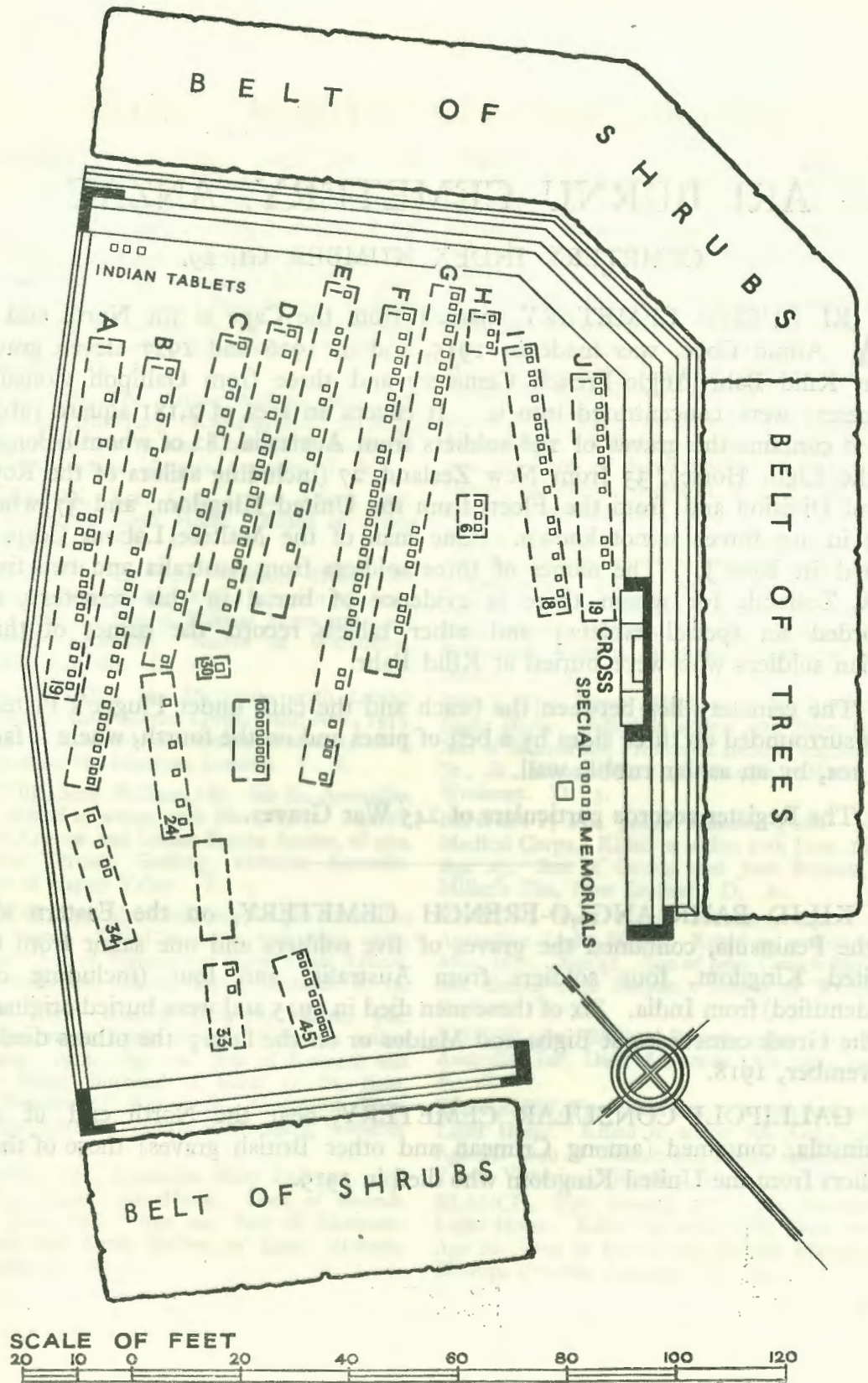

THERE ARE FIVE UNIDENTIFIED GRAVES in this Cemetery. Of these, four are known to be the graves of soldiers from New Zealand and one is wholly unidentified.

ARI BURNU CEMETERY, ANZAC

CEMETERY INDEX NUMBER Gr. 29.

ARI BURNU CEMETERY, named from the Cape at the North end of Anzac Cove, was made in 1915, and in 1926 and 1927 eleven graves from Kilid Bahr Anglo-French Cemetery and three from Gallipoli Consular Cemetery were concentrated into it. It covers an area of 2,181 square yards; and it contains the graves of 148 soldiers from Australia (82 of whom belonged to the Light Horse), 33 from New Zealand, 27 (including sailors of the Royal Naval Division and from the Fleet) from the United Kingdom, and 37 whose unit in our forces is not known. One man of the Maltese Labour Corps is buried in Row J. The names of three soldiers from Australia and two from New Zealand, for whom there is evidence of burial in this cemetery, are recorded on special tablets; and other tablets record the names of three Indian soldiers who were buried at Kilid Bahr.

The cemetery lies between the beach and the cliff, under Plugge's Plateau. It is surrounded on three sides by a belt of pines and on the fourth, where it faces the sea, by an ashlar rubble wall.

The Register records particulars of 245 War Graves.

KILID BAHR ANGLO-FRENCH CEMETERY, on the Eastern side of the Peninsula, contained the graves of five soldiers and one sailor from the United Kingdom, four soldiers from Australia, and four (including one unidentified) from India. Six of these men died in 1915 and were buried originally in the Greek cemeteries at Bigha and Maidos or on the field; the others died in November, 1918.

GALLIPOLI CONSULAR CEMETERY, near the North end of the Peninsula, contained (among Crimean and other British graves) those of three soldiers from the United Kingdom who died in 1919.

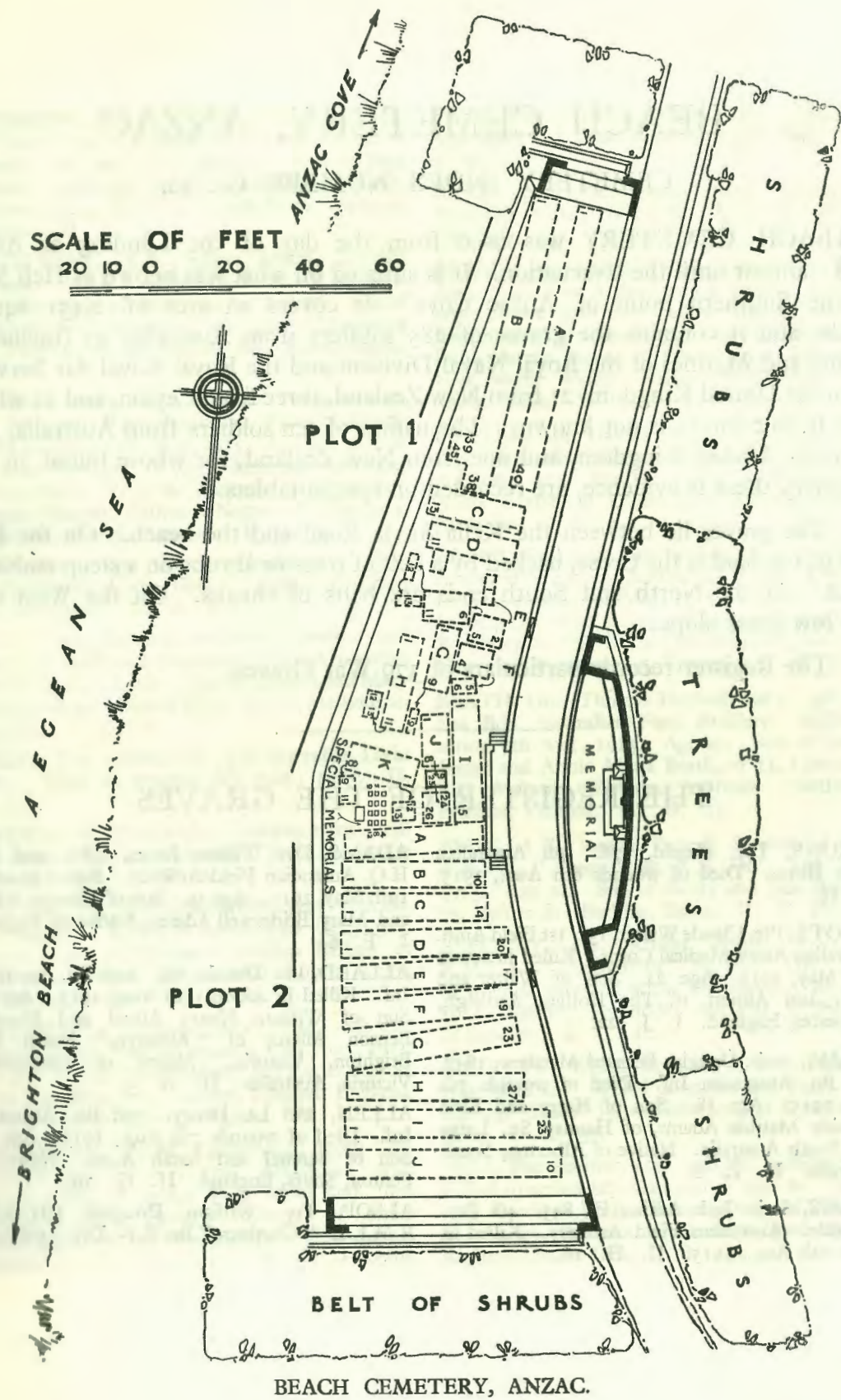

BEACH CEMETERY was used from the day of the Landing at Anzac almost until the Evacuation. It is situated on what was known as Hell Spit, at the Southern point of Anzac Cove. It covers an area of 2,451 square yards, and it contains the graves of 285 soldiers from Australia, 49 (including sailors and Marines of the Royal Naval Division and the Royal Naval Air Service) from the United Kingdom, 21 from New Zealand, three from Ceylon, and 21 whose unit in our forces is not known. The names of ten soldiers from Australia, one from the United Kingdom, and one from New Zealand, for whose burial in the cemetery there is evidence, are recorded on special tablets.

The graves lie between the Kelia-Suvla Road and the beach. On the East side of the road is the Cross, backed by a belt of trees or shrubs on a steep embankment. At the North and South ends are belts of shrubs. On the West side is a low grass slope.

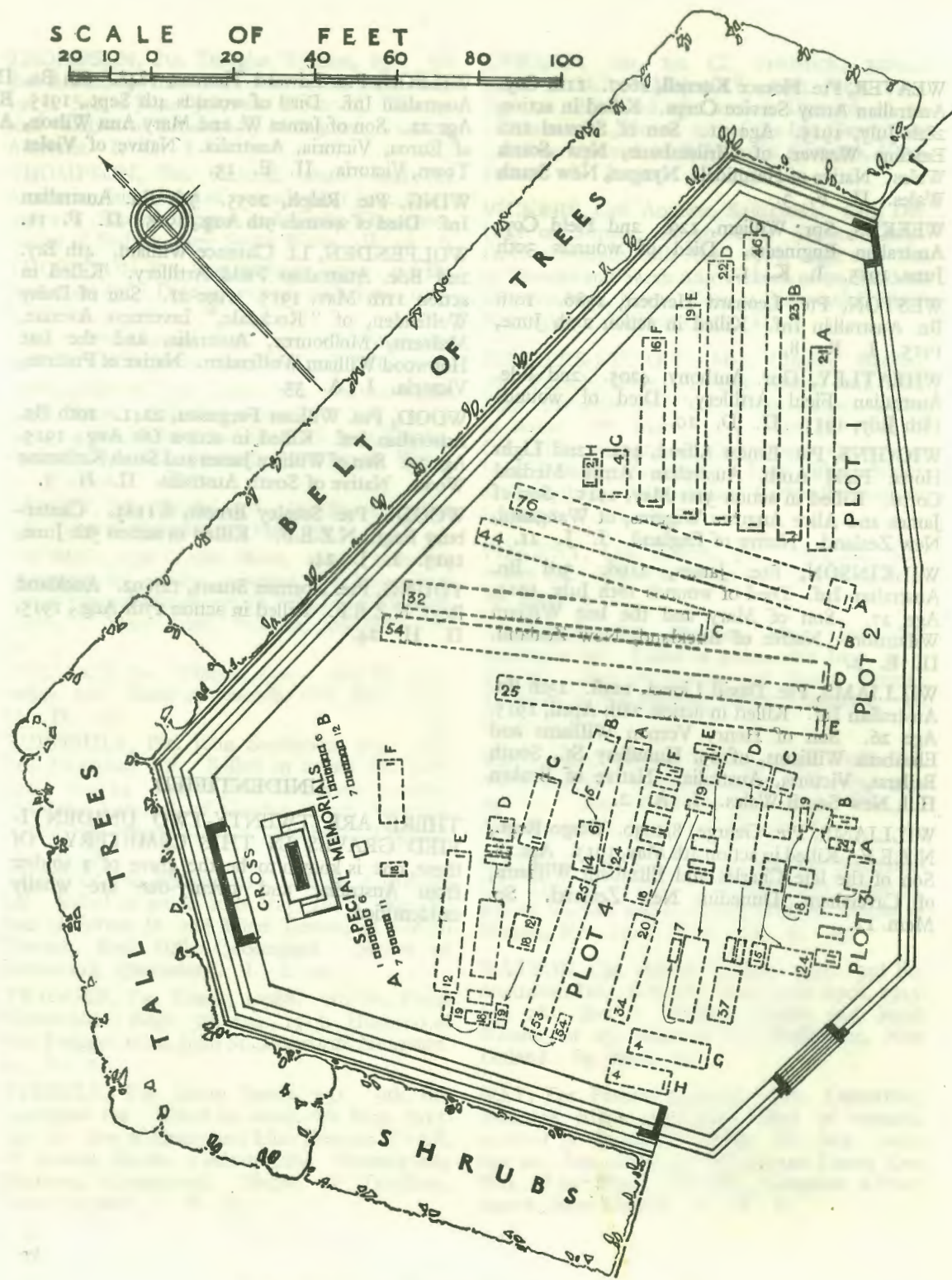

SHRAPNEL VALLEY (or Shrapnel Gully) runs from the West side of the Lone Pine Plateau, behind Maclagan's Ridge, South-Westwards to the sea near Hell Spit (Queensland Point). The upper part was called Monash Gully (after Sir John Monash, then commanding the 4th Australian Infantry Brigade). The main valley obtained its name from the heavy shelling of it by the Turks on the 26th April, 1915. It was an essential road from the beach upwards. Wells were sunk and water obtained from it in small quantities; on the South side of its lower reaches were camps and depots; and gun positions were made near the mouth of it.

The Cemetery was made mainly during the occupation, but partly after the Armistice by the concentration of isolated graves in the Valley. It covers an area of 3,377 square yards; and it contains the graves of 506 soldiers from Australia, 56 from New Zealand, 26 from the United Kingdom, and 72 whose unit in our forces is not known. The unnamed graves number 85; but special tablets are erected to commemorate 21 soldiers from Australia and two from the United Kingdom for whom there is evidence of burial in the cemetery.

The South-East side, which borders the bottom of the gully, is bounded by a concrete retaining wall, and the other sides by a belt of pines or shrubs.
